23<sup>rd</sup> June 2008

30<sup>th</sup> June 2008

Desmond and his team showed the movie “Faith like Potatoes” to a record attendance of over 70 inmates in the Johannesburg Prison. At the end of the show he invited the audience to the weekly devotional sessions. The group enjoyed the movie and was thankful that we could show it to them. He also handed out “Real Life” and “Shared Life” Bible Correspondence Course certificates to those inmates who had completed their lessons.

Lucas engaged about 80 children in Drama training at the Immanuel Parish in Kagiso on the 3<sup>rd</sup> July. Nine Sunday school teachers and seven youth volunteers helped. Lucas divided the kids into two age groups: the three-to-seven year olds learnt about “Story telling” and the eight-to-fifteen year olds participated in drama fun games and learnt a short skit called “Noah’s Ark”. Everybody enjoyed the “Old McDonald” song which Lucas changed to “Old Noah build an Ark”. They also learnt, “*What a friend we have in Jesus.*” The day was too short! The kids enjoyed it tremendously and 15 kids who don’t belong to any church may now have found a new church home!

14<sup>th</sup> July 2008

We handed out information about the “Bible Marathon” to our ETS Volunteers in Prison. The Bible Marathon has run for three years now and challenges participants to read the whole Bible in 90 days according to a reading schedule (October to December 2008). We encouraged them, however, not to wait for October, but to start immediately, because it is good to have more time to stop and mull over certain passages instead of just rushing ahead to finish. Many of the inmates don’t have Bibles, but they quickly asked to borrow a Bible from someone else for an hour each day!
